The Synodal Process has been conducted across the Church in Ireland from Autumn 2021. The publication the National Synthesis is the fruit of a wide-ranging process of listening and consultation drawing on the syntheses produced by the 26 dioceses in Ireland, as well as those submitted by religious congregations and other interested groups.

## **Tax Rebate on Weekly Contributions**

Sincere "Thank You", to all who have returned the CHY3 tax Certs, which were sent out to qualifying parishioners in recent weeks. For anyone who has not got round to returning them yet, it is not too late! Please return in envelope provided to Fr Richard or drop in to the Parish office.

The Parish benefits under a Scheme of Tax Relief for Eligible Charities.

If your contributions are over €250 in a year and you pay tax you qualify.

It would be very beneficial for our parish funds if you sign and return the Enduring Cert, which has been sent out in the last weeks to all eligible contributors.

The Enduring Cert covers 5 years so we can claim for previous years. There is no cost to you.

We hope everyone who qualifies will return the form in envelope provided to the parish office as soon as possible so we can proceed with the claim.

Also if any details have changed please amend so that we can update on our Parish system.
